Uniform Policy

This Uniform Policy and Dress Code applies at all times when students are required to wear their school uniform before, during and after school - no exceptions. The policy aligns with the STARR value of "Safe".

Parents and students agree to this policy upon enrolment.

Personal Presentation

- Uniform items are to be neat and clean.
- Uniform items are to be worn to size and design.
- Under-garments should not be visible.
- No large dangling or pointed earrings are to be worn.
- Jackets are to be worn correctly.
- Leggings and denim are not part of the College uniform.

Uniform Difficulties

Where a student cannot comply with the Uniform Policy, a parent / guardian note of explanation is required. Borrowed items that are not returned will be invoiced to parents / guardians. Non-payment of these invoices will be referred to the Manager Corporate Services. All exchanged clothing not collected by students will go to charity at the end of each term.

UNIFORM REFERRALS

Students who do not adhere to the Uniform Policy will be referred to Student Services.

First referral – student is sent to Student Services to change into correct uniform. If non-compliant, parent / guardian will be contacted.

Second referral – detention and a communication sent home to parent / guardian.

Third referral – student / guardian / parent interview.

Management

All students, parents, guardians and teachers have a role to play in uniform management.

- STUDENTS–will be made aware of the Uniform Code and non-compliance protocols.
- PARENTS–must be fully aware of the Uniform Policy, check students at home and respond to College communications.
- STAFF–all College staff share co-responsibility to manage the Uniform and Dress Code protocols.

The uniform of a Cecil Andrews College students is a symbol of membership of the College community. It promotes a sense of pride, unity, belonging and identity with the College. Wearing a uniform encourages students to take responsibility and ownership of their appearance.
